in Him we are one family



Jesus must have shocked the people listening to him the day members of his family stood outside his door waiting to speak with Him. "Who are my mother and my brothers?" He asked the people around him. "Whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister and mother" (Mark3:33,35).

Jesus had made it perfectly clear: in Him we are one family. We are as close to Him and one another as blood relatives, and He want us to treat each other as we would treat our own family members. He also wants us to truly be united in Him. So how can we become agents of unity in whatever family or community we find ourselves?

I want to talk about some very practical ways to work out our differences, avoid division, and love one another. To do these things, we need a heart of mercy and compassion and a deep desire for unity. But the more we practice, the better we become in preserving this precious unity that God has given us in Jesus

Christ.

LISTEN Truly listening, with our hearts and not just with our ears, is difficult. But it's the first step in understanding where another person is coming from and why they believe or act in a certain way. Especially when we have differences, we should ask the Lord to help us listen first to the other person and their side of the story. That requires that we withhold judgment while the other person is talking, and not try to formulate a response even before they have finished.

ASSUME THE BEST When someone acts in a way we don't expect, or that we even disapprove of, it's easy to assign some fault on their part. But what if we tried instead to look for a reason that put someone in the best possible light instead of the worst? How differently we would react to such situations if we tried to assume the best...even if that didn't turn out to be the case.

DON'T GOSSIP Gossip is destructive, not only to relationships, but to an entire community. And yet it can be so tempting to engage in it. That is why we need to guard our tongues at all times.

USE UPBUILDING SPEECH Negative humor is not the only way our speech can bring others down. Constant complaining is another way to poison an atmosphere. So is constant criticism. While we all have reasons to be angry or annoyed, whether at a situation or at a person, the way we express our feelings is critical. We need to remember that anger or irritation is contagious and can infect someone else, creating a general negative environment that can lead to discontent, rancor, and division. That doesn't mean we can't be honest and share how we feel or how we are dealing with a situation. But we can leave our listeners built up by staying hopeful or sharing how God is working in a situation.

AVOID FORMING FACTIONS It is tempting in situations for people to band together to try to push through their agenda. It takes faith and patience to wait on God to see what his solution to a problem might be. But it often leads to a better solution and avoids the need to take sides, which always risks lasting damage to a community.

FORGIVE AND ASK FOR FORGIVENESS For giveness is a two-way street. We need to ask for forgiveness when we have offended someone or let them down in any way, and we need to forgive when someone comes to us and says they are sorry. We all know how hard this can be, but for unity to grow, there is nothing more important than forgiveness and reconciliation. No matter how much we try to love one another, we will fail from time to time. In every situation, we need to ask the Holy Spirit to soften our hearts so that we are ready to forgive and just as ready to ask for forgiveness. The more often we so this, especially with minor offenses, the easier it gets and the more we are able to forgive when the offense is greater.

BE A WITNESS TO UNITY We all have an obligation to make our community a place where people can trust one another and grow in their faith. We can't control the actions and reactions of other people, but we can control our own. Our efforts to create loving communities and lasting relationships with our brothers and sisters do make a difference.

So keep asking the Holy Spirit to help you preserve unity, whether that's in your family, your small group or our parish community, or even in your workplace. Together, you can be a witness to the unity that God desires, both for our community of believers and for the world at large.



Even if you do not speak Greek, it is a wonderful language to introduce your child to. There are countless words in the English language that are of Greek origin. Exposure to Greek will assist your child with all content areas, especially with Math and Science as they progress through school.

Our Greek school is open to students of **other communities** as well as to those of the **greater community.** The St. Vasilios Greek School has functioned continuously since the founding of our parish. The Greek School is the oldest educational program within the church. The school offers the youth of our community knowledge of the Greek language, a love for the Orthodox Faith, and an appreciation for the culture and history of the Greek people. Our students build strong bonds with their classmates that last a lifetime. We will have an open registration this year, you can register here, or visit the church website to click on the link.

Greek School consists of 8 grades Introductory 3-4 year olds through 6th, open to students age 3 through 7th grade in American School.

Please note children must be 3 years old by September 1st and be potty trained in order to enroll in the Introductory Class.

Children age 3 can enroll in the Introductory class (3-4 year olds) and students entering Kindergarten can enroll in the Pre-School class. The Introductory class will meet every Wednesday. Pre-K through 6th grade will meet Mondays and Wednesdays from 3:45-5:15.

Our highly qualified and experienced teaching staff comes together to provide our community's children with knowledge of their heritage and Greek language. The staff adjusts the curriculum to the needs and abilities of our children who come from a wide variety of backgrounds. Our curriculum consists of conversational skills, culture, reading, religion, writing and dance. Our main focus is conversational skills and we spend a great amount of class time focusing on real life situations students can relate to.

We also offer preparation to students for the Ellinomatheia Exam. The Ellinomatheia is a certificate of attainment in Modern Greek and is an official certificate by the Greek Ministry of Education given to candidates who successfully complete oral and written exams in Greek. There are six levels (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2)

The A1 exam is for students ages 8-12 and we encourage all of our Greek School students to take this exam prior to completing our Greek School program.

In addition to this, students perform dance at a number of church and city events throughout the school year. The first event students are invited to perform in is the **International Festival that is scheduled for Sunday**, **September 7th!**

All students are invited to join us in dancing at the International Festival, we will have practice on Wednes-day, September 3rd at 3:45-5:00. Costumes will be provided!

The first day of Greek School is scheduled for Wednesday, September 18th. We will meet in the Greek School at 3:45 and head to the Church for Agiasmo. We will have a brief meeting following Agiamso and ask for parents to be in attendance.

Please register by August 20th in order to have books in on time for the first day of classes.






